Partnerships with Tulane and Ochsner Explored to Benefit Magnolia Clients and Services





Over the summer, Magnolia explored partnerships with two of New Orleans' trusted community partners, which will ultimately benefit Magnolia clients.

Under the direction of Dr. Sara Fernandez, Magnolia provided an educational experience for a medical school student, Charles Sisk. Charles immersed himself in the daily lives of our residents, performing various activities including drawing blood and responding to seizures. Upon his departure, he gave us many ideas to enhance our residents' physical well-being, and we plan to initiate some of these very soon. Charles remarked, "Perhaps the most crucial lesson learned during my placement is that just because a client does not say there is anything medically wrong with them, does not mean that there is absolutely nothing wrong." We plan to continue this venture with Ochsner's MD Program through the University of Queensland.

Magnolia administration recently met with a representative from the Tulane University School of Social Work. We are looking into the possibility of having students studying for their Master's in Social Work complete an internship at Magnolia. We hope these student interns would be interested in our field and working with our population.

We are happy to announce that Racquel Castaneda is our new Residential Program Manager. She is a first generation college graduate from a family that immigrated from El Salavdor. Racquel's brother has Down syndrome, and he inspired her to enter into this field. She has been an advocate for families and individuals with disabilities, in 2018 she Magnolia as a case manager. Racquel commented, "I have enjoyed my four years serving the clients and their families, and am excited to keep doing so as the Residential Program Manager."
